Dear Community,

It is a joy to resume a sense of normalcy after managing through Covid and all its complexities over the past two years. Despite the Covid challenges, our students and programs have thrived, and we continue to expand our programming so that we can support more students every year.

We are thrilled to have welcomed 60 additional Dream Scholars over this past year—elementary students from Alturas, Hailey, and Bellevue Elementary Schools. Our students are supported every day in our after-school programs with enrichment activities and academic tutoring that includes an intensive literacy program. Of our students who were identified as reading below grade level at the beginning of the 2021 school year, 75% were at grade level or above by the end of the year. Additionally, math, art, reading, games, social-emotional learning, and outdoor adventure are all part of our Dream Scholar days.

One of the most exciting milestones this past year was the graduation of our first cohort of Dream Scholars. **100% of the 45 members of our senior cohort graduated** with the Wood River High School Class of 2022. There was minimal student attrition over the years, and nearly all our 2022 graduates started in our 2012 class.

Approximately 80% of our graduating seniors have continued onto post-secondary education. They are attending colleges and universities around the country, community colleges, vocational schools, and the military. Others have gone onto apprenticeships, jobs, and steps toward their career. We are extremely proud of all our graduating Dream Scholars.

We are pleased to share information from our 2021-2022 fiscal year in the following pages. We are grateful to you, our generous community, our many community partners, and to the Blaine County School district, for making our work possible.

All of us at the "I Have a Dream" Foundation, wish you a happy and healthy 2022-2023.

# The Beginning of Big Dreams

### From first grade to first job!

"I Have a Dream" Foundation - Idaho Cohorts 2, 3 and 4



Sixty elementary students from families who demonstrated the financial need and program commitment will be supported from early elementary school through high school and post-secondary education.



Academic support, social and emotional learning and enrichment programming and community service. Tuition support for our students who continue to additional college education, trade, or vocational training after high school graduation.



Year-round, long-term, individualized, academic tutoring, mentorship, family engagement, comprehensive support, referrals, advocacy.



To narrow the education and opportunity gaps for low-income youth. Early academic and social-emotional intervention provides opportunities for our students to achieve and succeed at the rates of their higher income peers.



# Program components





Homework support, subjectmatter tutoring, test support, credit recovery, college preparatory support, college and career success programs.



Social-emotional learning, life skills acquisition, leadership training.



Outdoor experience and education, cultural enrichment (arts, music, theatre).



## Community

Hands-on service projects in partnership with other nonprofits throughout Blaine County to give back, support our community, and collaborate with other entities.



### **Family Engagement**

Engagement with families to support their child's academic development through participation in our service projects, enrichment programs and regular meetings with Dream teachers to review their child's progress and needs.



### Mentorship

Supportive and caring community volunteers, matched with Dream Scholars, provide individualized guidance, scholastic support and serve as positive role models.



### **College and Career Prep and Success**

Students receive college and career preparatory services from our College Counselor so that they can pursue college, university, trade or vocational school, apprenticeships, military service, and other continuing education goals after high school. Our Counselor supports students after high school, and into their post-secondary endeavors to support persistence and graduation from post-secondary schools.

# Impact



#### **100% Graduation**

Comparatively, in Idaho graduation rates are 70%-75% in the demographic we serve, and nationally, graduation rates for low-income youth plummeted in the past two years.



80% of our graduating cohort is continuing onto college, university, trade, vocational or military education and training. Comparatively, 50% of Idaho students go on to post-secondary education, and even less in the demographic we serve.



**75%** of our first graders moved from reading below grade level at the beginning of 2021 school year to being at grade level or above by the end of the academic year.



High School Dream Scholars perform hundreds of hours of community service annually. Elementary Dream scholars begin participating in community service in elementary school.



Dream Scholars become leaders, peer tutors, engaged and contributing community members.

# Collaborative Programs

Collaborative partnerships are an integral part of what we do. We partner with other public and private entities to collectively support hundreds more students by pooling in human and financial resources.

### **Credit Recovery**

In partnership with Wood River High School staff, we deliver summer programming to support Wood River High School students to recover credits lost during the school year and catch up to their classmates.

### SummerBridge

In a program spearheaded by the YMCA and in partnership with the BCSD, College of Idaho, Lee Pesky Learning Center and The Community School, we joined forces to deliver a collaborative program to support over 250 elementary students in an educational and enriching summer program.

### **Idaho Base Camp**

In partnership with Idaho Base Camp, our staff works to provide outdoor education and enrichment programs to all our Dream Scholars, each week.

### **Swiftsure**

Some of our Dream Scholars have been selected to participate in equine therapy in our new collaboration with Swiftsure Ranch.

### Bellevue, Alturas, Hailey Elementary Schools and Blaine County School District

Our Dream Scholars come from these three South Valley elementary schools. Our programs take place in modular units on the Bellevue Elementary School Campus. We look forward to expanding our programs in the South Valley and into the North Valley at Hemingway Elementary School next fall!

### **The Hunger Coalition**

Snacks provided by The Hunger Coalition supplement snack time for our growing elementary students.

### **Sun Valley Museum of Art**

As part of our growing partnership with SVMoA, our Leadership Cohort presented their final photo-voice project to the community at SVMoA's Hailey location last spring to celebrate local heroes, through their "lenses."

Our young Dream Scholars will visit the museum for art education and engage in art projects with museum staff.

### **Eduardo Escalara**

Outstanding Youth Philanthropist, 2021, Eastern Idaho, Idaho Non-profit Center.

This Dream Scholar has dedicated much time, over many years, to community service. He continues his service as a youth leader of the Community Table while attending the Sun Valley Culinary Institute. His commitment to giving back was recognized by the Idaho Nonprofit Center in 2021.

Dream Scholar and Certified Nursing Assistant, Janileth Ruiz, began working for the Senior Connection's Vision and Hearing Center after graduating last spring. Our students participated in service projects at the Senior Connection for many years so this is a wonderful culmination of our organizations collaborative work.



Our inaugural benefit and celebration kicked off our new fiscal year in August. **Thanks to you**, we raised over \$600,000 which will allow us to expand programs and serve many more Blaine County youth!
